Peer Counseling - Out center offers peer counseling services free of charge to members of the community. <u>Case Management through Tennessee Health Link (a TennCare ONLY service)</u>: Health Link providers commit to providing comprehensive care management, care coordination, referrals to social supports, member and family support, transitional care, health promotion, and population health management.

<u>Comprehensive Child and Family Treatment –</u> services are high=intensity, time-limited, goal-specific services designed to provide stabilization and deter the 'imminent' risk of states custody for the child/youth, CCFT services concentrate on child/family/guardian behaviors and interactions with the goal of reaching an appropriate point of stabilization so the individual can be transitioned to a less intensive outpatient service. CCFT services can be provided in home, community, or office-based settings using a frequency appropriate for the intensity and imminent risk presented by the clinical situation. This service is for ages 3 to 18 years old. HCA serves all counties in Tennessee.

<u>Outpatient Mental Health Counseling</u> - services offer a wide, comprehensive range of flexible and responsive interventions tailored to the individual child's and family's needs. Out clinical staff utilizes cognitive/behavioral approaches and other therapeutic services to teach families new skills so that client/family can more effectively manage their lives. This program serves all ages.

<u>Intensive Outpatient Program</u> – services provide integrated treatment for co-occurring substance abuse and mental health issues. IOP services are designed to prevent higher levels of care, help sustain long-term sobriety, mental health and support clients remaining in their permanent homes and environments. Our agency serves ages 13 to 17 in our adolescent program and over the age of 18 in our adult program. We have an adolescent group and 2 adult co-ed, co-occurring groups.

<u>Health Connect Clinic</u> - was established to support the therapeutic services provided to our clients and their families by offering psychiatric assessments with medication management. To do this, we have placed a system of highly visible and universal signs at local establishments.

The Helen Ross McNabb Center's Safe Place provides community-based emergency shelter for adolescents age 12-17. Youth in need of shelter are placed in host homes located in the Knox County region. Reunification with family, or identifying a permanent option, begins immediately upon admission to the program.

<u>Youth Emergency Shelter</u> – YES, Inc., formerly Youth Emergency Shelter, was established in 1975 by a group of concerned citizens to provide care for children with nowhere else to go. Since then, YES has cared for thousands of children all across East Tennessee and beyond. YES, is a temporary home and place of stability for children who need immediate care, where they



receive everything necessary for daily life including a bed, food, clothing, hygiene care, safety education, counseling and love. YES, Inc. also provides mentoring and therapeutic art programs for children.

The Keys of Hope Women's Housing Program

The Keys of Hope Women's Housing Program houses women for up to two years, giving them the time needed to become responsible, independent, and empowered to overcome significant life obstacles. Whatever the reason for a woman's stay, the program's goal is to provide affordable housing in a safe environment with supportive services that promote self-sufficiency without regard to race, ethnicity, national origin, religion, sexual orientation, or disability. Housing only available for women with no children in their care.

To participate in the program, women must:

- Be 18 years or older with no children in their care
- Complete an application form and have a face-to-face interview with Women's Housing Program staff
- Provide proof that she is working at least part-time (or has some form of stable income such as social security), attending school, participating in vocational training, or volunteering
- Be committed to a drug- and alcohol-free lifestyle
- Be able to tolerate a diverse population of women
- Show proof of a current TB test


